All borderdyke irrigators should now all be receiving the TXT reminders the day before they are due to water. If there is any confusion, please call the Raceman. We are gradually introducing the online notification system for spray irrigators, thank you to those who are making the effort, we are looking to run some training sessions in the new year for those who are not yet using the system. We are always open to feedback on how we can improve communication with irrigators.

Work has begun on the new office building at our Papakaio depot and is progressing well, with plans to in the new building early in the new year.

A decision has been made to establish a memorial to the late Sid Hurst, two plaques will be erected one at the Awamoko domain and one at Borton's pond along with the planting of a tree in recognition of Sid's contribution to irrigation and farming in the area and beyond.

There will be official unveiling to be held at a date yet to be confirmed.

Farm Environmental Plans (FEP's)

Those farms with a 'C' or a 'D' rating or have a new management should have be expecting a visit from Irricon to carry out farm audits in over the next few weeks.

Fish Barrier

The Company have employed Riley Consultants to come up with some alternative options for the fish screen at Bortons Pond after plans to construct a rock barrier type screen were put on hold due to uncertainty around the effectiveness to screen all fish.

Scheme development

Construction of a new 16000m3 scheme balancing pond at the end of the Hilderthorpe Race at Steward Road has been completed and commissioned. The Company are still investigating options to construct a forth balancing pond in the Seacliff Road area. There has been an increasing number of enquiries to convert from borderdyke to spray irrigation with 500ha changing to spray for this season, and as much again on the books for next year.

It is of upmost importance that you contact the race manager well in advance of any proposed irrigation redevelopment.
